Her mother worked for some of the top interior designers in Toronto and her father became an accomplished HVAC contractor. “I grew up around building plans and job sites,” Dani says. “It fostered the desire to pursue the career I’ve been engaged in since 1997.”

How in the world, then, did this 34-year-old German national end up in Pittsford? Through her husband, Keith, whom she met the following year while he was in Toronto. The couple married in 2004 in a cathedral in her hometown of Düsseldorf, Germany, and Dani now proudly admits to being “a resident alien” of the United States. Keith is an engi-

neer at OGP in Rochester. The Polidors have one child, Mia Marjorie, who is 9 months old.

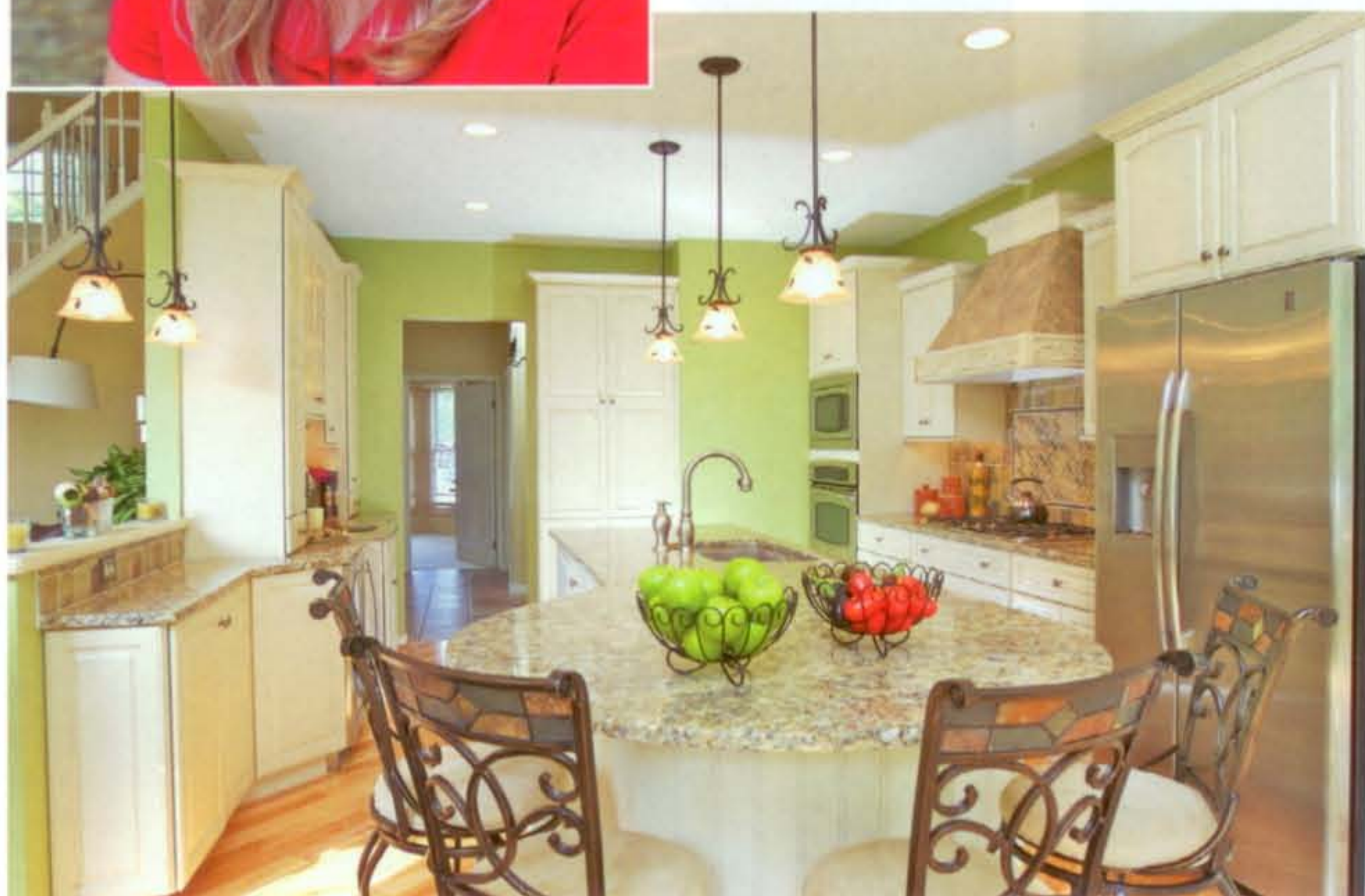
With nine-years experience running her own kitchen and bath remodeling firm in Toronto, Dani was looking for a new opportunity in the quaint town of Pittsford. Dani’s NKBA entry is a kitchen project completed in a 13-year-old house. “It is quite spectacular,” according to Dani, “in that gorgeous granite dominates a keyhole-shaped island. Painted maple Omega Embassy cabinetry is finished with a soft glaze that accentuates the unique slate backsplash and stainless steel GE appliances. A glass door section over the wine bar is a great place to display favorite crystal. Lighting is the key to a successful design. No expense was spared in lighting this kitchen; a leaf theme is continued in the light fixtures. It was introduced in the custom hood and is repeated in the metal accent tiles. Overall, the customer is thrilled with their investment and the young family enjoys their ‘designer’ space daily.”

When it comes to materials, Dani always opts for the quality inherent in brand-name products. For cabinetry, she prefers reliable products such as Omega Embassy, Plain and Fancy and DBS.
